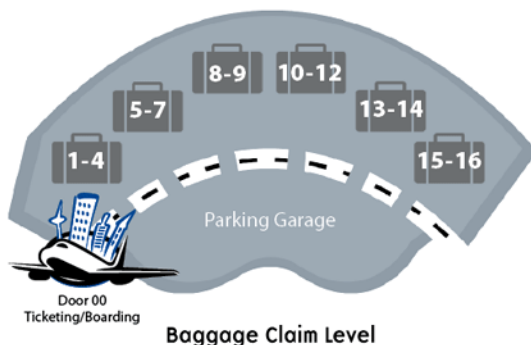

Ground Transportation

For those Driving:

From Sea-Tac Airport:

Follow signs to 518 East/I-5 Northbound. Exit right onto 518 East. Exit from the left lane onto I-5 North. Continue on I-5 North for 14 miles. Exit from the left lane at Seneca Street. Right on Sixth Avenue. Right on Pike Street. Left on Eighth Avenue. Left on Pine Street. The Grand Hyatt Porte Cochere will be immediately on the left.

From I-5 North Bound:

Exit from the left lane at Seneca Street. Right on Sixth Avenue. Right on Pike Street. Left on Eighth Avenue. Left on Pine Street. The Grand Hyatt Porte Cochere will be immediately on the left.

From I-5 South Bound:

Take the Union Street Exit. Continue forward onto Union Street. Turn right on Seventh Avenue. Right on Pike Street. Left on Eighth Avenue. Left on Pine Street. The Grand Hyatt Porte Cochere will be immediately on the left.

From I-90 West Bound:

Merge onto I-5 North via Exit #2c toward Madison Street/Convention Center/Vancouver, BC. Take Madison Street/Convention Center exit. Follow exit forward onto Seventh Avenue. Right on Madison Street. Left on Eighth Avenue. Left on Pine Street. The Grand Hyatt Porte Cochere will be immediately on the left.

Tuxedo Rental:

Area Attractions:

If you have never been to Seattle, you can check out the sights by taking a ["Virtual Tour"](#) of the city at the Seattle.gov web site. The tour uses a clickable map that calls up pages about a given area in Seattle, such as the Ballard Locks, Shilshole Marina, Arboretum, University of Washington, Lake Union, Alki Beach, etc. A click on Downtown will bring up a more detailed map where selections include the Waterfront, the Pike Place Market, Pioneer Square, and the Seattle Center.



Ballard Locks

The Ballard Locks connect Puget Sound with the fresh water of Salmon Bay, Lake Washington, and Lake Union where you can watch vessels being raised and lowered. The locks also features seven acres of botanical gardens and salmon fish ladders that can be seen from an underwater viewing window.

Experience Music Project

The Experience Music Project, located near the Space Needle, is an interactive museum featuring a repository of more than 80,000 artifacts, including what is reportedly the world's largest collection of Jimi Hendrix memorabilia. Visitors to the museum will discover a hands-on experience intended to draw them into the creative processes involved in making music.

Museum of Flight

The Museum of Flight showcases the history of aviation technology from its inception to the present. Exhibits are housed in the Red Barn, Boeing's first manufacturing plant, and in the glassed-in Great Gallery Complex located near Boeing field.

Pacific Science Center

Located under the arches near the Space Needle, the Pacific Science Center is a six-building complex offering hands-on science adventure. It also contains a planetarium, a three and one-half story IMAX theater, and the Spacearium featuring laser light shows.

Pike Place Market

Since 1907, local farmers have been offering fresh produce at the Pike Place Market. The market complex is home to several hundred businesses, ranging from fish markets to arts and crafts shops, bookstores, street musicians, and dozens of restaurants, delis, and take-outs.

Pioneer Square

Pioneer Square is a 30 block historic district that has sidewalk cafes, art galleries, antique shops, boutiques, nightclubs, restaurants, and parks.

Seattle Aquarium

The Seattle Aquarium, located at Pier 59 on the waterfront, features several species of birds, fish, invertebrates, and marine mammals. Highlights include the 400,000-gallon Underwater Dome with a 360 degree view of Puget Sound's aquatic life, the Pacific Coral Reef Exhibit, the Tide Pool Exhibit, sea otters, seals, and a salmon ladder and hatchery.

Seattle Art Museum

The Seattle Art Museum, located in downtown Seattle, features more than 20,000 art objects, from African, Asian, ancient Mediterranean and Egyptian collections, to old master paintings and contemporary Northwest art. The museum also houses a cafe and store.

Seattle Center

Site of the 1962 World's Fair. The 75-acre campus is home to numerous festivals, sports events, and concerts. On-site attractions include the Seattle Center House, Seattle Center Monorail, Fun Forest Amusement Park, Pacific Science Center, Space Needle, Experience Music Project, Seattle Repertory Theatre, Seattle Center Opera House, KeyArea, and more.

Seattle Waterfront

The Seattle Waterfront is a great place to stroll where a variety of shops, restaurants, and coffee shops can be found. Waterfront Park offers a great view of the Seattle skyline and oceangoing vessels on the Puget Sound.

Space Needle

The Space Needle, Seattle's crowning landmark, offers a 360 degree view from the observation deck which includes both an indoor and outdoor viewing deck, a gift shop, and an espresso bar. Above the observation deck is a revolving restaurant offering Northwest cuisine.

Washington Park Arboretum

The Washington Park Arboretum is a 200 acre living museum of trees, shrubs, and vines featuring more than 10,000 exotic plants. The grounds also include a 3.5 acre Japanese Garden that features azaleas, Japanese maples, rhododendrons, camellias, evergreens, mosses, ferns, a pond, and a tea house.

Woodland Park Zoo

The Woodland Park Zoo, located near Green Lake in Seattle, provides naturalistic homes for more than 300 species of wildlife.

Frye Future

Frye Art Museum

Frye Future might seem a misnomer for an exhibition displayed according to nineteenth-century conventions. However, it's indicative of the incredible surge of conceptual growth the Frye has experienced over the past two years, during which the Museum reevaluated its vision, mission statement, guiding principles, goals, and exhibition strategies.

Spectatorship and Desire: Love 2

In *Love 2* the artworks remain in position on the gallery walls, while everything else about the exhibition changes, including wall color and labels. *Love 2* has a single author, using the paintings as a conceptual jumping-off point to write about film, art, or literature.
