Corporations Canada	Corporations Canada charges less for online processing of incorporation applications and annual returns than for paper processing. We do not differentiate by means of payment, whether cash or credit/debit card.

Colorado	We used to have a very large fee differential for online filings (payable only by credit card, debit card or prepaid account)

	versus paper filings. For example, annual reports were (and still are) \$10 if filed online but \$100 if filed on paper. However, we mandated online filing for all of the documents that are available online, so there is no longer a choice of filing online versus on paper. We do not distinguish between credit cards and debit cards.

District of Columbia	In the District of Columbia fees are the same without regard to the form of payment.

Indiana	No difference if filing by paper. However if filing electronically there is an additional administrative fee for the customer. Additional \$1.00 fee + 2% of total transaction.

Kansas	Kansas does not charge additional monies for the type of payment. Our online filings in most cases are less expensive than filing paper. This is hopefully encouraging our users to utilize the online process, and reduce our costs. Our adoption rate for online filings has been fairly successful. Our online is provided by an outside vendor and they do take a portion of the fee collected to cover their expenses.

Virginia	Virginia only accepts credit card payments and eChecks for online transactions. A convenience fee is charged and collected by our third-party payment vendor for these transactions. Otherwise, there is no fee differential for electronic versus paper filings.
