Texas	<p>Texas does global filings (referred to as Master Assignment and Master Amendment) to change Secured Party Information.</p> <p>We filed 11 of these in calendar year 2012 and so far have filed 7 in 2013.</p> <p>Not sure what you mean by a wildcard for name and address. What I can tell you is that the way it works is the filer identifies what the current Secured Party name and/or address is. Then tells us what the NEW Secured Party name and/or address needs to be. They attach a text file containing all the filing number that will be affected and the change gets added to every filing identified.</p> <p>The cost in Texas is \$10 each for the first 50 (so a minimum of \$500) and then just 50 cents for every filing beyond the first 50.</p>
Utah	Utah offers global amendments, but they are rare. Our process is such that the "wild card" is not really necessary. We have feedback with the filer prior to making the change. We hope to automate the process with a "management" account for the big guys.

From Dennis Hankins (Illinois): Does Texas use the usual UCC 3 Amendment form or does Texas have a separate UCC 3 Master Amendment form?

Reply from Randy Moes (Texas): We use the standard UCC 3 Amendment form.

Box 1. For the Initial Financing Statement Number says something like "See attached list of filing numbers"
The remainder of the form is filled out like a normal Amendment or Assignment (whichever was requested).
The list of Initial Financing Statement Numbers is attached as page 2 thru whatever is necessary.
