California	<p>1. Do you send acknowledgments via email for online and paper filings? We provide an acknowledgment letter and acknowledgment copy for every filed document. If the filing was completed online, the filer provides an email address as part of the log in process and we send them a link via email where they can access the electronic version of the items, which can be printed. If the filing was submitted on paper, we generate paper versions and mail the items to the filer.</p> <p>2. Do you send subsequent filing acknowledgments via email to the Secured Party of record at the email address on file? Even if not provided on the subsequent filing? The acknowledgment letter and copy are returned to whomever submitted the documents for filing. We do not communicate with the secured party for every subsequent transaction that occurs.</p> <p>3. How does a secured party change their email address for acknowledgments? n/a</p> <p>4. Are they required to file an amendment to change their email address? n/a</p> <p>5. Do you accept IRS Tax Liens via XML filings? IRS sends us paper and we return acknowledgement information to them electronically. In looking ahead to a new system, we talked with them last year about the possibility of moving towards electronic filing and IRS explicitly indicated they were NOT interested</p>

Illinois	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Do you send acknowledgments via email for online and paper filings? Electronic acknowledgements for online UCC filings only. 2. Do you send subsequent filing acknowledgments via email to the Secured Party of record at the email address on file? Even if not provided on the subsequent filing? No 3. How does a secured party change their email address for acknowledgments? The email address is captured at the time of filing. We do not require an account be set up prior to filing online. We do however require an established account for XML B to B users. 4. Are they required to file an amendment to change their email address? N/A 5. Do you accept IRS Tax Liens via XML filings? Not at this time, but Illinois received the same information Texas received. The Fed's stated they were doing some satellite testing a few years ago but could not substantiate the cost of programming XML nationwide.
Indiana	<p>Indiana is the same as Kentucky with our current system and tax liens.</p> <p>With the new system we would like to expand our ability to send acknowledgments via email, even for filings that are submitted by paper. Based on the conversations at IACA, we would need to add a specific place on the form to allow customers to request the return of acknowledgment/receipt via email – this could even be something as simple as a check box that refers to the email in the contact information section of the form.</p> <p>In regards to how a secured party changes the email address – in the current system and I believe in the new system, the address would be based on the address entered at the time of processing the filing. If the user had a profile, they would update the email address in their profile.</p>

Kansas	Kansas does not send acknowledgments by email for online filings. Customers filing online must print their acknowledgments when they file. All Federal tax liens are filed on paper.
Kentucky	<p>Kentucky also does not send acknowledgements by email for online filings. The customer would print the acknowledgement at the time of filing.</p> <p>State and federal tax liens are filed at the local county clerks' offices and are not filed with the Secretary of State in Kentucky.</p>

Paper filing acknowledgments are returned by mail.</p> <p>2. Do you send subsequent filing acknowledgments via email to the Secured Party of record at the email address on file? Even if not provided on the subsequent filing? No.</p> <p>3. How does a secured party change their email address for acknowledgments? They log in to their UCC Online account and change their email address under the account management link.</p> <p>4. Are they required to file an amendment to change their email address? No.</p> <p>5. Do you accept IRS Tax Liens via XML filings? No.</p>
Minnesota	<p>1. Do you send acknowledgments via email for online and paper filings? No we do not. Online user receives a link to their acknowledgment on their conformation page upon filing. User clicks on the Image link (PDF format) to view, print or download the acknowledgment. We mail back paper filings.</p> <p>2. Do you send subsequent filing acknowledgments via email to the Secured Party of record at the email address on file? Even if not provided on the subsequent filing? N/A</p> <p>3. How does a secured party change their email address for acknowledgments? N/A</p> <p>4. Are they required to file an amendment to change their email address? N/A</p> <p>5. Do you accept IRS Tax Liens via XML filings?</p> <p>No. Our office receives the Federal tax liens in an electronic file from the Internal Revenue Service. We then distribute the filings to the counties as appropriate and file in our records those filings appropriate for the state-level filing.</p>

Montana	<p>For documents received internally if the customer requests the confirmation and copy of image with burned filing information be returned by email we accommodate their request. In addition, the customer may submit a letter notifying us they want "all" correspondence returned by email, which we accommodate. For online filings, the users receive a copy of the image burned with the filing information along with correspondence they may download and print we also send an email to the user with a link to the correspondence and image. Online users may update their email address online and internal users may simply submit a letter with the updated information. We currently do not accept Federal Tax Liens by XML.</p>

Texas	<p>1. Do you send acknowledgments via email for online and paper filings? We send acknowledgments via email for online filings only.</p> <p>2. Do you send subsequent filing acknowledgments via email to the Secured Party of record at the email address on file? Even if not provided on the subsequent filing? No.</p> <p>3. How does a secured party change their email address for acknowledgments? The only email acknowledgment</p>

	<p>sent is for online filings. When an online customer logs in to their account they can have the acknowledgment go to the email address that is currently in their client account, or they can change the email address after they log in.</p> <p>4. Are they required to file an amendment to change their email address? No. Clients are able to update their client account information at will.</p> <p>5. Do you accept IRS Tax Liens via XML filings? No. We had recent discussions with the IRS about filing electronically, but they indicated that they had limited success with this and that the cost of maintaining an automated system with single jurisdictions was too expensive. It was no longer a priority for them.</p>

Wisconsin	<p>From Wisconsin:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Wisconsin sends acknowledgments electronically for online filers only, not for paper filers. We are looking at the possibility of sending acknowledgments via email for paper filers. 2. No. Email addresses are not currently stored in our system. 3. Since we don't require, screen for emails or capture email address information, we have no way to know that their email is updated unless we physically take the time to look through sequential filings (original – continuation – assignment – continuation) 4. This is up to the filers to determine whether they find it necessary to change the email address and how to file the change if they deem it necessary. 5. We do not accept IRS Tax Liens via XML.
